LOCATION	PHOTOGRAPHIC SITES OF INTEREST:		
Corinella Cliffs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Past Grantville, turn right at Water Tank retailers. Once in Corinella park at the Jetty, go left around the shoreline to a great section of volcanic, vibrantly colored, rocks !! 		
San Remo Jetty (K8>) & Bridge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pelican feeding begins at 12pm. Giant stingray often attend & are visible from jetty • Phillip Island bridge provides a great vantage point for sandbar photos @ low tide 		
Newhaven Marina	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • & Boat Ramp (J7>) Pelicans often wait here for another feed. Great sailing fleet ! 		
Churchill Island	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (G&H6>) Historic homestead & working farm attraction. Walking track with photo opportunities re: cape barren geese, highland cows, mangroves & moonah trees. 		
Woolamai Surf Beach (H10>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spectacular beach and view left across to the Pinnacles on Cape Woolamai State Faunal Reserve. Great walk to Pinnacles. 		
Rennison Point	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (G7>) Great at low tide & evening sunsets with fabulous grasses & moonah trees. 		
Smith's Beach	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (A7>) Accessible rock pools at low tide (check time). Interesting rock formations 		
Pyramid Rock	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (J9>)Left down Pyramid Rock Rd. Quite spectacular views. Cliff top walk quite easy. 		
Chickory Kilns There are many of these historic relics on the island	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • South side of Back Beach Rd, between Berry's Beach Rd & Kitty Miller Rd. F&G6< • Harbison Rd, just off the Phillip Island Tourist Rd, on the northern edge of the Koala Conservation Reserve. It's a quick right once you've turned off on Coghlin's Rd 		
Kitty Miller Bay (E7<)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bit of a climb down, but some pretty agates can be found on the rocks. If you're really enthusiastic, you may like to see the wreck of the SS Speke in the next Bay 		
The Nobbies Centre	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • & Seal Rock (A8<) Marvellous views. Long boardwalks around to Blowhole. Birds nesting on bare cliff face. Can be very windy so bring a jacket despite the weather. 		
Phelan's Bluff (D7<)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Leave Nobbies via Reserve Rd to Summerlands Estate (now a Ghost Estate). This south coast road will soon be closed to cars, so take this route for more great views. 		
Cat Bay (C6<)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Park at bottom of Stephens Rd to get down to Cat Bay (larger carpark to left). Fabulous tall jetty poles remain – great photo opportunity depending on light !! 		
McHaffie Point	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (E3<) Impressive cliffs and rock pools great for evening & sunset shots. 		
Red Rocks Point	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (G2<) Ditto above comments 		
Cowes Jetty	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (K2<)A very friendly seal has been entertaining the tourists at the end of the pier. 		
Rhyll Inlet & Bird Sanctuary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • (C3>) & Swan Lake (D6<) both look best after a big 'wet', but are well worth a visit.
