Photoshop Vs Lightroom

I've been using Photoshop since version 3 in 1994, when I was shooting film and scanning shots for tweaking in this magical new digital darkroom, blissfully unaware of the earth shattering tsunami called digital photography that was about to come crashing down on us all. Jump forward to 2002 where you could get a 6-mega pixel camera for under \$10,000 and the mass exodus from film to digital had well and truly begun.

Nowhere was this more evident than in Photoshop, with 2002's version 7 introducing a file browser to help you sort through the enormous volume of images you were now shooting and an obscure little plug in called camera raw, to allow you to access these even more obscure things called raw files, which Photoshop simply could not open.

Now jump another few years forward to 2005 and the release of Photoshop CS2. Camera Raw is fully built in, file browser has become Bridge and everyone is shooting digital. But boy is it a cumbersome workflow jumping all over the place from Bridge to Camera Raw to Photoshop and back, losing track of what adjustments you have made to what files and where?

Well, January 2006 was a good time for Photographers when Lightroom first appeared on the scene. Taking all of what we had learned in the tumultuous years of transition from film to digital, Adobe decided to start again and build a piece of software firmly grounded in the age of digital photography.

I now cannot imagine a world without Lightroom. It is such a beautifully designed piece of software I get almost as much pleasure teaching it as I do using it. Sure Photoshop is still there huffing and puffing in the corner, but as I say in all my classes, Lightroom is for image processing and every image needs processing, Photoshop is for image surgery and NOT every image needs surgery.

I hope you can come to one of our special VAPS Lightroom classes some time soon and experience the sheer joy of Lightroom, truly the digital photographers best friend.



Judging – A Discussion Piece by Bob Thomas (Secretary, ESPS)

One of the central and most controversial issues in camera clubs is the performance of judges. All too often criticisms are raised regarding the quality of judging and their failure to deliver the requisite balance of critique, assessment and education. Club members often have unrealistic expectations, seeking judges who will remain totally objective, and who will leave their own personal preferences at the door before delivering unique comments on an ever increasing number of images. Additionally, VAPS is expected to deliver a steady stream of qualified judges to replace judges who are retiring due to age, exhaustion or simply an inability to live up to the demands made of them.

Clubs need to appreciate that VAPS is only as strong as its member clubs, and the provision of good judges is a collective responsibility. It therefore remains our collective responsibility to reassess the overall problem as being a systemic one rather than a VAPS issue. We need to consider what we, as member clubs, can do to rectify the overall judging problem, and to arrest the decline in competent judges.

There is one solution which potentially can restore the efficiency, integrity and effectiveness of the judging system and that is panel judging rather than individual judging. Panel judging minimises the idiosyncratic nature of individual judging and provides a more balanced assessment of images. We use panel judging for higher level competitions, so why not for normal competitions at the club level?

Panels have several advantages over individual judging. Firstly, individual bias is diluted by a three person assessment, with a generally more equitable outcome. Additionally, by exchanging panels, clubs can minimise costs if the respective panels waive fees in return for reciprocal judging. One club judges another's images, and that club returns the favour at a later date. Better outcomes, zero cost and a healthier interaction between clubs. The added bonus is that each member of a judging panel gains experience in a supportive environment which can ultimately lead that member to becoming a judge in his or her own right. Currently, new judges have no established pathway. They become judges automatically and commence judging with no prior experience. Recruiting new judges from existing panels would provide a learning pathway which would better prepare prospective judges for solo judging at some later point. This is an obvious benefit to both individuals and clubs, who would avoid the possibility of engaging inexperienced judges.

Some clubs already use panels and have established relationships with local clubs. A wider adoption of this practice would go a long way to alleviating some of the problems we experience today. It would provide a way forward into a future which currently lacks direction. Better judging is one of the keys to a better club experience, and we do need to get away from criticising an overworked pool of judges by finding a longer term solution.

Why not consider panels for your club? Contact an adjacent club and discuss reciprocity. Give your members experience at judging rather than being judged. Look at judging from the other side of the fence and see how rewarding it can be. Perhaps we can all learn from the experience and appreciate that although judging can be a thankless task, it need not be. Judging is a central issue, so let's collectively address the way it is done.
